Minutes of the Nineteenth Academic Council Meeting held on 09th July, 2021 at 3.00 PM in Virtual Mode using Google Meet

At the outset, Dr. Udaya Kumar Susarla, Principal extended a warm welcome to all the members of the Academic Council.

Agenda Item1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the Academic Council Meeting held on 07-06-2021

Approval: Minutes of the Previous (eighteenth) Academic Council Meeting already circulated were presented by the Principal and viewed by the members. The academic council approved the same without any changes.

Agenda Item 2: To consider and ratify the results of the examination held in February/March, 2021.

Proceedings/Discussion:

CoE presented the results of all the examinations conducted by GCET since the last Academic Council meeting, including revaluation results. He further mentioned that these results have been vetted by examination results committee nominee of JNTUH.

Approval: The academic council ratified the following results

- B. Tech I/II/III/IV year I semester regular/supplementary examinations of AR16 and AR18 regulations.
- B. Tech I/II/III Year II semester supplementary examinations of AR16 and AR18 regulations.
- MBA II year I semester regular examinations of AR18 regulations
- MBA I/II year I/II semester supplementary examinations of AR16 and AR18 regulations.
- M.Tech I year I semester, I year II semester and II year I semester examinations.
- Revaluation results of all the examinations mentioned above.

Agenda Item 3: “Any other Item”

- a. To Consider and approve conducting II mid-term examinations of B. Tech II and III year along with semester end examinations for the academic year 2020-21

Approval: Academic Council members, approved the proposal of conducting II Mid-term Examinations of B. Tech II and III year II semester for the academic year 2020-21 along with

Semester End Examinations with a break of 15 minutes between mid-term examination and semester end examination.

The II midterm examination mentioned above shall be for a duration of 30 minutes and the question paper pattern for it is as follows:

- Multiple choice questions: 10 for Ten marks
- Fill up the blank questions: 10 for Ten marks
- Short answer questions: 05 for Five marks
- The question paper shall be permuted and shall be made into four sets.

Academic council members approved the duration of the midterm examination and the pattern of the question paper

- b. To consider and approve exemption from earning up to six (06) credits for re-admitted students under AR 16 regulations, whose first admission was under R15 regulations of JNTUH.

Proceedings/Discussions:

Explaining the reasons for seeking exemption as above, the Principal made a submission to the members as follows:

The relevant clauses under JNTUH's R15 Regulations read as under:

- **Clause 7.5:** A student shall register and put up minimum attendance in all 226 credits and earn 218 credits. Marks obtained in the best 216 credits shall be considered for the calculation of percentage of marks.
- **Clause 8.3:** When a student is detained in a semester/year due to shortage of attendance, he may be re-admitted when the same semester/year is offered for the next academic year for fulfillment of academic requirements. However, the academic regulations under which he was first admitted shall continue to be applicable to him.
- **Clause 8.4:** When a student is detained due to lack of credits, he may be promoted to the next academic year only after acquiring the required academic credits. However, the academic regulations under which he was first admitted shall continue to be applicable to him.

As per clause 7.5, the student will be deemed to have fulfilled the academic requirements if he earns 218 credits out of 226 credits prescribed. The student is, thus given an exemption from earning up to

Eight (08) credits. Since, as per clause 8.3 & 8.4, R15 regulations of JNTUH will continue to be applicable to the students admitted under R15 Regulations of JNTUH, and rejoined after detention due to shortage of attendance/credits under changed regulations, they will be eligible for credit exemption. The college, therefore, sought the guidance of the Academic Council for granting exemption of two theory courses subject to a maximum of six (06) credits, to all students re-admitted under AR16 Regulations (Autonomous) of GCET, who were first admitted under R15 Regulations of JNTUH.

The JNTUH nominee, Dr. K. Vijaya Kumar Reddy, Professor of Mechanical Engineering, and Director, R & D, JNTUH, opined that the regulations under which of the student was first admitted into shall hold and remain applicable as per JNTUH's R15 regulations when the student takes readmission in the new regulations, and therefore, the request of the college for extending the benefit of exemption to the students first admitted under JNTUH's R15 Regulations, and readmitted subsequently under the autonomous regulations of the college is reasonable, and hence can be agreed to. This opinion was also shared by other members, and the proposal was approved by the Academic Council.

Approval: The Academic Council approved granting of exemption from two theory courses subject to a maximum of six (06) credits for re-admitted students under AR16 regulations, whose first admission was under R15 Regulations of JNTUH.

Principal thanked the members of Academic Council for their support.
